

January is always a good time for a reset of goals for the new year. Have you thought of adding READING as one of your new goals to reach new ideas and actions for your life? Books provide all kinds of benefits! Fiction allows one to escape into a world of fantasy. Christian Living books give help and hope for growing in your Faith. Biographies give a window into the lives of many faithful Christ followers. There are many books on Parenting and Marriage which also give great advice and counsel.

During our Winter term the Adult Library is offering a **WINTER READING CHALLENGE**. Twelve different reading genres are included in the challenge. The challenge will be finished at the end of April. **The book list will**

be found on the check out table in the Library. We encourage you to read through the whole list. If this seems overwhelming to you, simply try to read *one* of the listed books for each of the three months. At the end of April, turn in your book list even if it is only partially completed. Hopefully this might be the encouragement you need to step into the library and see the variety of books that are available for your enrichment. There just might be a prize waiting for your participation!

During the month of **February** we will be featuring books on the **Parent-Child relationship**. We have been adding new books to this area. **Two newly added highlighted books to consider** . . . *Raising a Modern Day Knight* by Robert Lewis and *Giving your Words the Lifegiving Power of a Verbal home for Family Faith Formation* by Sally and Clay Clark. You will find these Parenting books and many others, located on the display table to make it easier for a selection. Finding time to read during the season of parenting is sometimes elusive. We however want to encourage each set of parents to find one book from our display table to read together. Use this as a springboard for conversation to build better parenting actions.



The **Children's Library** will be featuring the **theme - Love in Action - during the month of February.** A variety of books on showing love and kindness will be highlighted during this time. Our table activities always enhance the learning focus for the month.

Last fall when I brought my outdoor plants inside for the winter, I placed them in the guest bedroom to bask in the sunny south window. Normally, when I do this I set a reminder on my phone to water the plants (because they can easily be forgotten in the guest room!). I forgot to set the reminder and around Christmas, I ventured into the guest room to find my lovely peace lily completely wilted, leaves limply hanging over the edge of the flowerpot. I thoroughly drenched the drooping plant's dry soil. Happily, in a few hours, the leaves perked up. But over the next few days, I saw evidence of the plant's near-death experience! Quite a few leaves turned brown and crispy, other leaves developed brown tips. Several buds dried up. After a thorough trimming, the plant looks better. (And there is now a reminder on my phone to water my plants!)

It's January; there is most of a brand-new year stretching ahead for us. What does an arid plant have to do with a new year? Trying to face a new day, a new month, or a new year without a well-watered soul means you will become like my withered plant! We cannot leave our souls un-watered and expect to thrive!! When we go through a dry season after failing to prioritize time in Scripture, we might "perk up" when watered with the living water—but damage is incurred.

In 2022, I wrote a monthly snippet of what I was reading as I journeyed through the Bible with two friends. Last year completed my third successive reading through the Word of God. The value in this is that I am gradually getting a fuller view of the unity of Scripture and of the overarching story of God's pursuit of sinful man through redemption. I'm starting to remember where things are in the Bible. This Bible survey—repeated year after year—has been one of the most beneficial practices I have undertaken. I'm taking my fourth journey through the Bible with a friend in 2023.

A Bible survey is very important—but it needs to be supplemented by deeper exploration. What do I mean by that? We also need to study, meditate on, and memorize the Word of God. Fine, but where are we supposed to find time to get all of that done?? Here's how it works for me; your approach might be completely different. My Bible reading takes about 20-30 minutes of my morning. It's non-negotiable that I start my day with coffee in my cup and my Bible on my lap.

I study in the evening. This time commitment varies depending on what my week holds. I don't study every evening; nor do I keep a strict schedule. I'll chose a commentary of a book of the Bible to help me study more deeply over a period of months. Right now, I'm studying through Ezekiel with Derek Thomas' commentary "Ezekiel: God Strengthens." When I study through a book, I'm in no hurry. I take my time, lingering over passages and concepts. You could use your small group study as your study time or linger over the book that Pastor Craig is preaching through. You could listen to a sermon series or do a concept or word study. Make it fun, make it something you're interested in

To meditate, I copy a verse, a paragraph, or a passage and carry it with me on a note-card or in my phone as a note that I can pull up when I'm walking or waiting at an appointment. You could tape the notecard to a mirror or your kitchen window. Meditation leads to memorization!! (Which makes it easy to "kill two birds with one stone.")

We know, more fully than ever after having lived through 2020, 2021, & 2022 that surprising and difficult things may await us in the months ahead. We might be tempted to approach the new year with apprehension. But as Christians, we should be the most hopeful people in the world because we have a living hope (1 Peter 1:3-4) Let's not let the soil of our souls grow arid as our leaves hang limp! Let's water our souls by reading, studying, meditating & memorizing the Word of God in 2023! (Email me and tell me how you will be interacting with the Word of God in 2023!)




Merry Christmas & Happy New Year!

We were able to bless over 400 women in prostitution with food kits, words of encouragement, smiles, prayers and Christmas cheer. One women said; "the best thing is that you always remember us, that makes us feel loved." Consistently doing this year after year builds trust and shows love.

We had a celebration together of the 9 years that God used this residential ministry to bless so many people. As we look back to the last 4 years we can only surrender to God with thankful hearts as we count our blessings. We surrender in awe seeing that indeed He can and will (and has done) more than we can think or imagine. In fact, He can do more, according to His Word in Ephesians 3:20. A short summary of what we are thankful for is that He gave us a new family(a church body), two more boys, coworkers, new friends and family close by. And as we think about the new year He has given us, we can only surrender all our plans and desires to Him, looking forward to how He plans to use us for His glory and purpose. As we think of His purpose, we are certain that we were all made to know Christ and to make Him known. Everything else is a means to His end. 
We pray that making Christ known be your main resolution this year.

Yesterday I finished reading the book of Isaiah. There are many interesting and encouraging verses among all the prophecies of destruction and exile. Denise and I have had several discussions as whether these verses apply to us or not, and as most of these are addressed to Israel, they certainly make us think of the Lord's goodness even after affliction and we find application and encouragement for us in our lives.

It makes our little misadventures seem pretty insignificant, doesn't it? Today, New Year's Day, we move into a new apartment here in Tbilisi, Georgia for the next two months. The war still continues in Ukraine and although we would like to get back there for a few months this year to help them print the first Bible on the new press, we don't know exactly when or how that will work out. Meanwhile, we have Brazilian friends coming to work here in the beginning of February so we hope to help them get settled in a little. We will also continue helping the team here with various things that they are involved in.
