**OCTOBER IS CHURCH LIBRARY MONTH.** Many of you have enjoyed the Adult Library and have availed yourselves to the many different books and DVD's on our shelves. Some of you have used the room for quiet reflection. The conference table has become a very versatile piece of furniture which has been used for meetings as well as a place to set snacks and drinks. All of these activities are encouraged. The Library is a place of retreat and hopefully a place where all feel welcomed!

#### Some interesting facts you might find interesting . . .

- \* Our **Adult Library** has around 2000 books
- \* Quarterly we purchase and add new books to our shelves. If you have an author or book suggestion, please let the librarian know!
- \* We have 5 different genres represented. These include Fiction, Biographies, Christian Living, Marriage & Family and Social issues.
- \* We have a section of 5 different Commentaries along with a variety of useful handbooks and reference materials. If you are teaching and need some Resources or Helps, please look on our Reference section to help you find answers.
- \* We have a large section of quality DVD's available for your viewing.
- \* The table set along the north window will always be a quick look at some of our current featured books. If looking through the shelves for a book seems overwhelming, stop by the table and pick up something that catches your eye. These book choices are changed out regularly.
- \* The check out table often will have a seasonal reading handout or other tools and resources for your use.
- \* During the month of August a deep cleaning of all the book shelves and updating of all our records were done. Every book was touched and evaluated before placing them back on the cleaned shelves. This is a big task but one that needs to be done yearly. We have our collections recorded on hard copy spread sheets as well as within our card file box. Leda Graybill is a big help in the work and also in creating the electronic pieces. This clean up and updating has also been done in the Children's Library.
- \* The **Children's Library** is the gathering place for our children! It is a happy place with a lot of activity. It is generally unsupervised and yet the children manage the activities and book check out very well. The older children help the younger kiddos with many of the table activities. This is healthy and great to observe! Many books are checked out on a weekly basis.
- \* The Children's Library usually has a monthly theme focus and the activities and books will reflect these themes.

The goal of the Library Team is to develop ongoing libraries that presents relevant materials that will nurture faith and Christian living. We continue to look for edifying and engaging books and resources.

Recently I switched up my prayer plan and started using the familiar ACTS format: Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, & Supplication. I printed the acronym on a single sheet which I fill out every Wednesday morning to pray for the coming week. Over the next few months, I will unpack a section of the ACTS format and share how it is helping me to pray in a more focused way. Last month I shared how I'm learning to adore God through my prayer time. This month I'll focus on confession.

What is confession? The dictionary defines it as: "a formal statement admitting that one is guilty of a crime; an admission or acknowledgment that one has done something that one is ashamed or embarrassed about." In court of law, evidence is laid out that shows the law was broken. Based on that evidence, the individual is found guilty or not guilty. Confession of sin is admission of guilt. When we confess our sin, we with God that we have broken God's law, and we stand guilty before Him.

How do we confess our sins to God? When we trusted Christ for our salvation, God imputed on us the righteousness of God. "For God made Christ, who never sinned, to be the offering for our sin, so that we could be made right with God through Christ." (2 Corinthians 5:21) But, even though we are made right with God, we continue to sin. We sin by what we think, say, do, or fail to do. It seems best to immediately confess sin when we realize we have done wrong.

So, in my focused prayer time, what role does confession have if I'm not saving up the list of sins to confess to God? I have been praying through Psalm 51, David's Psalm of confession, one verse at a time. It is reminding me of how my sin offends our Holy God. It is reminding me of God's great compassion toward me. As I pray over the verses, I'm often reminded of ways in which I've sinned against God that I have glossed over or not remembered. I confess those when the Holy Spirit brings them to my attention.

Other passages I will pray through after I'm finished praying through Psalm 51 are Daniel 9:4-19, Ezra 9:6-15, and Nehemiah 9:5-36. Each of these biblical prayer confessions include:

- Testimony of God's character
- Acknowledgement of sin(s)
- Prayer for a humble, contrite heart
- Gratitude for assurance of forgiveness

It is a mistake to think that as we are spiritually, we will have less need to confess. The opposite is true. (Romans 7:13-25) The more mature we are in our faith, the more sensitive we become to the Holy Spirit's nudging regarding sin in our lives. We will gain an awareness of sin in areas we've never noticed before. And we confess it, repent, and grow in faith. Proverbs 28:13 "People who conceal their sins will not prosper, but if they confess and turn from them, they will receive mercy."

Is important to know God's Word, so we know what is in opposition to God's holiness. "How can a young person stay pure? By obeying your word. I have tried hard to find you—don't let me wander from your commands. I have hidden your word in my heart, that I might not sin against you." Psalms 119:9-11

God, because of your unfailing love. Because of your great compassion, blot out the stain of my sins. Wash me clean from my guilt. Purify me from my sin. For I recognize my rebellion; it haunts me day and night. Against you, and you alone, have I sinned; I have done what is evil in your sight. You will be proved right in what you say, and your judgment against me is just. Psalm 51:1-4 NLT

I John 1:9 assures us that when we confess our sins, our faithful God will forgive us and cleanse us. Confession restores closeness to God, brings healing where sin has brought brokenness, restores our joy, and make us usable to God.
