


Rids Sing for Easter

Vonnie's Views

Recently on a walk with my 8-year-old grandson, the topic of discussion turned from robots to idols. He asked me to describe world religions that use idols for worship. As we talked about various religions that have idols, I asked him if he knew that the Bible talks quite a bit about idols. I reminded him that when

he was about 4 years old, his favorite passage (one we read every time he came over for a couple of months) was Isaiah 44. At that time, we affectionately referred to it as the "idol passage." He, of course, had forgotten—it was half a lifetime away for him!

Isaiah 44 describes a blacksmith and a carpenter who use metal or wood to make an idol. Isaiah describes the carpenter's process in detail: marking the outline, roughing it out, shaping it & finishing it. Then Isaiah tells us the carpenter used the remainder of the wood to build a fire for warmth and cooking.

Half of the wood he burns in the fire; over it he prepares his meal; he roasts his meat and eats his fill. He also warms himself and says, "Ah! I am warm; I see the fire." From the rest he makes a god, his idol; he bows down to it and worships. He prays to it and says, "Save me! You are my god." They know nothing, they understand nothing; their eyes are plastered over so they cannot see, and their minds closed so they cannot understand. No one stops to think, no one has the knowledge or understanding to say, "Half of it I used for fuel; I even baked bread over its coals, I roasted meat, and I ate. Shall I make a detestable thing from what is left? Shall I bow down to a block of wood?" Such a person feeds on ashes; a deluded heart misleads him; he cannot save himself, or say, "Is not this thing in my right hand a lie?" (Isajah 44:16-20)

On another night, unable to sleep, I listened to Psalms with the YouVersion audio Bible,
Our God is in heaven; he does whatever pleases him. But their idols are silver and gold, made by human hands. They have mouths, but cannot speak, eyes, but cannot see. They have ears, but cannot hear, noses, but cannot smell. They have hands, but cannot feel, feet, but cannot walk, nor can they utter a sound with their throats. Those who make them will be like them, and so will all who trust in them. (Psalms 115:2-8)

A few days later, my Bible-reading plan took me to 1 Corinthians 10 where I read Pau 's warning to flee idolatry (vs 14). In 1 Corinthians 10:20, Paul says, "the sacrifices of pagans are offered to demons, not to God..." While idols can't move, talk, or see, idol worship is not innocuous, idol worship is, in fact, demon-worship.

As these similar passages popped up within a few short days, the topic of idolatry seemed to be following me! I was curious what God was saying to me today through this. So, I began by asking, what is idolatry? Of course, worshipping an image is something I'd never do. According to Webster, idolatry is "the worship of idols or excessive devotion to, or reverence for some person or thing." An idol is anything that replaces the One True God.

If I don't worship images, do I maintain idols of a different type? Are there things I prize more than God? Sometimes it's hard to tell—because I have it justified in my mind. A quick look at a few things proved eye-opening. How am I spending my "free" time? Do I spend it mindlessly scrolling, being lazy, or resisting serving others? Guilty. What thoughts occupy my mind? Are my thoughts of me, how others perceive me or how I can attain status? Guilty. Where is my treasure? Is it the size of my retirement account, health, or recognition? Guilty. Do you not ce what's at the center of each of these? ME—not God!

Each of us has a heart that is easily captured by things like possessions, careers, hobbics, sports, goals, greed, cravings, and innumerable other things. Some of the things we idolize are clearly sinful. But many of the things we idolize are good. When anything takes the place in our heart that should be occupied by God, it is an idol. Even an idol like this is fueled by our enemy—the thief that comes to steal, kill, and destroy. Things that replace God cause us to feed on ashes—unappetizing, right? Idolatry of any type leads to a deluded heart as we follow a lie—the lie that anything other than God will bring deep satisfaction and true joy.

How can I pursue God and enjoy life, create projects that make me proud, pursue goal, and enjoy downtime? Scripture tells us that, whatever we do, we are to "do it all for the glory of God" (1 Corinthians 10:31) and that we are to serve God only (Deuteronomy 6:13; Luke 16:13). A few ways I thought of that will help me do this are: time with the Lord in His Word daily, memorizing the Word, keeping a prayer journal, being present and active in my church, listening to praise music, accountability with believing friends, and asking the Holy Spirit to convict me when I veer toward idolatry by failing to do all for the glory of God.
