"The Lord sits enthroned over the flood; the Lord sits enthroned as king forever. The Lord gives strength to his people; the Lord blesses his people with peace." —Psalm 29:10–11 (ESV)

Floods are overwhelming—powerful, fast-moving, and out of control. A gentle stream can turn into a raging river in moments, sweeping away everything in its path. In many ways, the image of a flood captures what life can feel like: rushing, unpredictable, and too much to handle.

And yet, Psalm 29 gives us a stunning picture of God in the middle of it all: "The Lord sits enthroned over the flood." He is not tossed by the waves. He is not scrambling to sandbag the rising waters. He is enthroned—reigning, ruling, completely in control—even in the chaos.

This is a powerful reminder: God is sovereign not only in times of calm, but in the most destructive and terrifying moments of life. When our world feels like it's collapsing or spinning out of control—He is still King. Whether we're facing personal loss, illness, uncertainty about the future, or the weight of global events, nothing catches Him off guard. He reigns over it all.

But here's where the psalm becomes deeply personal. The same God who sits enthroned over the flood is the One who gives strength to His people. He isn't distant or detached. He isn't observing our situation from afar. He is present and offers His very presence, His power, and His peace to those who trust in Him.

That's especially important to remember when we feel the flood of life is drowning us. Sometimes it's not just one overwhelming thing—it's several, all at once. And in our desperation, we cry out, "God, where are You?" Psalm 29 answers: "Right here. Ruling. Reigning. Strengthening. Blessing."

Although God is not the author of evil or sin, Scripture shows us clearly that He can and does work through the brokenness of this world to fulfill His purposes. He is sovereign without being the source of sin. He remains holy, pure, and just—and nothing lies outside His control. It's a deep mystery; one we are incapable of fully comprehending this side of heaven. But it's woven throughout the story of Scripture, and it allows us to rest in the truth that our King is *both* powerful and good.

This psalm ends with a beautiful prayer: "*May the Lord bless His people with peace*." That's not just a hopeful wish—it's a declaration of what God delights to do. And the ultimate fulfillment of that promise is found in Jesus Christ.

On Good Friday, it looked like the overwhelming flood had won. Jesus—the Messiah, the hope of the world—was crucified and buried. Darkness fell. Hope seemed lost. But on Easter morning, Jesus walked out of the tomb—alive, victorious, and enthroned forever as King. Death, the final and most fearsome flood, was defeated along with sin, shame, and fear. Because of Jesus, the floods of this life do not have the final word. The King who sits enthroned over the flood is the same One who gives His people strength and blesses them with peace—today, tomorrow, and forever.

So how do we respond?

We respond in faith. We trust that even when we don't like or understand what's happening, God is still in control. We pray for His strength and receive His peace. We turn our eyes away from the rising waters and fix them on the One who reigns above them.

And we possess peace that surpasses all understanding (Philippians 4:7). In a world that feels like it's constantly in crisis, we are enabled to be people of calm and confidence—not because we have it all together, but because we know the One who *holds* all things together (Colossians 1:17).


Whatever flood you may be facing today, take heart: the Lord still sits enthroned over it. He is your strength. He is your peace. And He is your King—forever.
