- * Demonstrate acts of Service Be the hands and feet of Jesus









Vonnie's Views

This month is a reprint of June 2021 Vonnie's Views. Once again, I'm reading Ezekiel and wanted to share this with you again. Enjoy!

I have just finished the book of Ezekiel. What a majestic end to this book of judgement: a temple with a river of life flowing out of it and refreshing all into which it flows. A theme from these final chapters is LIFE from DEATH. This theme starts with the bleached-out and scattered bones coming to life (Ezekiel 37); it ends with the river of life flowing into the dead sea which begins to team with life.

This makes my pulse quicken, it infuses me with anticipation and hope!! All is not hopeless; all is not lost. It might seem that way right now; *but our vision is limited*. The Bible is full of examples of the visible vs the invisible (but just as real as the visible).

One example that comes to mind is Elisha's servant in II Kings 6 being completely overwhelmed by the surrounding enemy army. (The army was there because there was a price on Elisha's head because he was reporting to the King of Israel what was whispered in the enemy King's secure chamber.)

The Lord opened the servant's eyes to see the hills were FULL of horses and chariots of fire. The human army that had previously looked totally intimidating now looked puny and powerless. The chariots of fire didn't show up when the servant's eyes were opened; they were there all along--present but unseen; unseen but real. JUST LIKE IT ALWAYS IS!! There is more to every situation than meets the eye. We may feel alone or overwhelmed, but we need to remember that our God is mighty to save.

What does this have to do with the dead bones and the dead sea?? There is no situation beyond hope! Our God "...gives life to the dead and calls into being things that were not." Romans 4:17b. So, "against all hope, Abraham in hope believed...without weakening in his faith he faced the fact that his body was as good as dead--since he was about 100 years old--and that Sarah's womb was also dead. Yet, he did not waver through unbelief regarding the promise of God but was strengthened in his faith and gave glory to God, being fully persuaded that God had the power to do what he had promised." (Romans 4:18-21, emphasis mine)


When I look around and feel discouraged, I need to remember that my hope is in the Lord! As I think about all my prayers over decades which are yet unan-

swered, I am so thankful for the end of Ezekiel and for all the other passages about God bringing fruitfulness from barrenness, life from death, and belief from unbelief!

In my vision, the man brought me back to the entrance of the Temple. There I saw a stream flowing east from beneath the door of the Temple and passing to the right of the altar on its south side. The man brought me outside the wall through the north gateway and led me around to the eastern entrance. There I could see the water flowing out through the south side of the east gateway.

Measuring as he went, he took me along the stream for 1,750 feet and then led me across. The water was up to my ankles. He measured off another 1,750 feet and led me across again. This time the water was up to my knees. After another 1,750 feet, it was up to my waist. Then he measured another 1,750 feet, and the river was too deep to walk across. It was deep enough to swim in, but too deep to walk through.

He asked me, "Have you been watching, son of Then he led me back along the riverbank. When I returned; I was surprised by the sight of many trees growing on both sides of the river. Then he said to me, "This river flows east through the desert into the valley of the Dead Sea. The waters of this stream will make the salty waters of the Dead Sea fresh and pure. There will be swarms of living things wherever the water of this river flows. Fish will abound in the Dead Sea, for its waters will become fresh. Life will flourish wherever this water flows. Fishermen will stand along the shores of the Dead Sea. All the way from En-gedi to En-eglaim, the shores will be covered with nets drying in the sun. Fish of every kind will fill the Dead Sea, just as they fill the Mediterranean. But the marshes and swamps will not be purified; they will still be salty. Fruit trees of all kinds will grow along both sides of the river. The leaves of these trees will never turn brown and fall, and there will always be fruit on their branches. There will be a new crop every month, for they are watered by the river flowing from the Temple. The fruit will be for food and the leaves for healing." Ezekiel 47:1-12 NLT

A Gospel Voice for the Jungle and the Canyon



Three partners, three shortwave transmitters, covering most of Peru with Christian radio

In the last year or so, we have been privileged to help three different ministries as they use radio to reach many people groups in Peru.

Radio Sendas Cristianas installed a new shortwave transmitter in March 2023 near Arequipa, Peru. Our partner ministry, SIM, has been broadcasting via FM to the Cotahuasi Canyon since 2008. Due to the size of the canyon and the nature of FM they were unable to cover the area well. SIM missionary, Brad Shaw, came to Son-Set Solutions asking for one of our suitcase shortwave transmitters. The transmitter was manufactured at SonSet Solutions and finally shipped to Brad late in 2022. In March of this year a team of volunteers and local staff helped to build the new site and to set up the transmitter

and antenna. Brad's wife, Gina, says, "The next big project, which will surely be ongoing, is getting more of the shortwave solar radios to Peru and distributing them. Visiting extremely remote alpaca & llama shepherds, high in the Andes Mtns. will be an interesting challenge. They are the folks that we really hope to reach as they most likely have very limited access to any gospel witness." Here in Elkhart, we have 2,480 SonSet® Radios tested, tuned and ready to ship to Peru.

Tim regularly assists our partner Ethno Media Associates with transmitter questions and parts. In recent months, SonSet Solutions manufactured and shipped a new shortwave transmitter to Peru. The old transmitter in Chazuta has not been operating at full power. Now Radio Logos is at full power and able to reach the thousands of indigenous peoples in this large and remote part of Peru. They are broadcasting in 11 of the 17 languages of the area. Radio Logos was built in 2012 as a collaboration between Ethnic Radio, HCJB Global and a local evangelical church. "We provide the tools and training," says Ethnic Radio technician, Ray Rising, "they do the rest." SonSet Solutions has also provided 2,620 SonSet® Radios to Ethno Media Associates/ Ethnic Radio.


Radio Integridad utilizes one of our suitcase shortwave transmitters as part of their network, broadcasting the hope of the gospel 24 hours a day across Peru. We were able to assist them with a part for the transmitter recently.

 There is much work to be done in Tuba City, AZ. New concrete anchors for the tower, guy wires for the tower, move the FM antenna to the tower. We are working to put together a team and a plan for this work.


Snapshots of our lives... inside and outside of SonSet Solutions
