Singspiration

Our Annual Singspiration was held on July 28th. The Music and Worship Committee put together a list of songs requested from the congregation. Each of the different Worship Teams lead a group of songs. Following the time of worship singing together, homemade ice cream and toppings was served and enjoyed in the fellowship hall.









A few weeks ago, I experienced three distinct encounters, each occurring in close succession, which profoundly deepened my understanding of the effects of sin in our lives and the transformative power of salvation. Allow me to explain.

My first encounter was through my daily Bible reading. At that time, I was studying the book of Jeremiah. Jeremiah prophesied during the final decades of the nation of Judah, just before the 70-year Babylonian captivity. For over 25 years, he tirelessly called God's covenant people to return to the True and Living God. He urged them to abandon their pagan idols and abhorrent worship practices, which included ritual prostitution and child sacrifice, and to embrace righteousness, justice, and mercy. Despite his persistent efforts, Jeremiah's message was met with rejection and mockery. He was imprisoned, threatened with death, and his people remained stubbornly drawn to false prophets and sinful pursuits. Their inclination was away from God and toward evil.

The next encounter occurred while I was preparing for a Monday evening ladies' Bible study. That week, we examined Luke 13:10-17, the story of a woman who had been crippled for 18 years. She was bent over and unable to straighten up. On that Sabbath, as Jesus was teaching in the synagogue, He saw her, approached her, laid His hands on her, and healed her. Immediately, she stood upright and praised God. In essence, Jesus "unbent" her.

The third encounter came through a daily audio devotional, *Things Unseen*, by Sinclair Ferguson. In this devotional, Ferguson described the sinful soul as "incurvatus in se"—Latin for "curved inward on itself." Due to our inherent sinfulness, our souls are like the woman in Luke 13: bent inward, away from God, and drawn toward sinful desires, much like the ancient Judeans. Our souls become misshapen and self-

centered.

Ferguson explains it this way:

...our sin means that we make ourselves, in a thousand different ways, the center of the universe. But then our soul is bent over, turned in on itself, separates itself from the source of true life and nourishment, and eventually starves itself of spiritual oxygen, shrivels up, becomes hard, and dies...So the question is, Is there a remedy for this sickness? Is there a divine pharmaceutical? Can we be saved from it? And the answer, of course, is yes, there is. There is restoration and healing and transformation for souls curved in on themselves, and it's available to us in Jesus Christ. His lordship over our lives, our submission to Him as our Savior, begins the marvelous reshaping of our souls. That's why the Son of God came from heaven. Because of our "incurvatus in se," we believe lies and pursue fleshly cravings, like the ancient Judeans. Similar to the woman of Luke 13, we cannot unbend ourselves, no matter how hard we try. Satan tells us we are destined to remain bent, that God is indifferent or hostile, and that He is unkind. Pride convinces us we don't need to change, that we are better than most and thus "good enough." Legalism suggests that if we try harder, follow the rules, and appear righteous to others, we'll be acceptable.

All of these are lies. It is only through the touch of the Master's hand that we can be truly unbent. As God, through the Holy Spirit, draws us toward Him, we are led to the Living Water and the Bread of Life. By grace through faith, we are enabled to approach our Savior, who has been waiting for us. He "unbends" us and begins the process of remaking us in His image, for His glory.
